Why make a bequest to Auckland Grammar School?

What becomes of your gift?

Bequests are directed to the Auckland Grammar School Foundation Trust. Independently administered, the Foundation Trust was established in 2000. The monies are invested to create a sustainable fund which contributes to the School's continuing academic, sporting and cultural success. The Foundation Trust trustees take their fiduciary responsibilities very seriously and understand their duty of care to you as a bequestor.

As a bequestor, you can indicate where your bequest is to be used and we would be delighted to have a conversation with you to best understand your wishes. For example, some bequests have been gifted to the Academic Endowment Fund (AEF) which was established to recruit, reward and retain great teachers. Sitting within the AEF are several funds – the General fund allows the Headmaster the discretion to acknowledge teachers each year, whereas the funds for Sports, the Arts and Culture enable the School to reward teachers for their dedication both inside and outside the classroom.

How to word your gift...

Making or amending your Will to include a gift to Auckland Grammar is simple and free. Please contact your solicitor to arrange this for you.

We recommend your solicitor uses the following wording in your Will for a bequest in support of Auckland Grammar School.

"I bequeath to the Auckland Grammar School Foundation Trust, a charitable trust registered with the New Zealand Charities Commission (CC27311) * a ... per centum share of my estate

or * the sum of \$...

or * a ... per centum share of my residual estate

or * description of property or assets.

for the general purposes of the Auckland Grammar School Foundation Trust and declare that the receipt of the Treasurer of the said Trust or other authorised officer shall be a sufficient discharge for my Trustee." "A bequest is beneficial to all parties.

We don't feel it precludes us from

certainly means we can give generously
at some stage in the future in recognition
of the great influence Grammar has
had on our family."
